## Insight Class Summary Report

An example of the Class Summary is shown in the last pages of this article. The Class Summary Report provides a distribution of Insight General Ability Index (gl) scores for same-grade students in a class. The name of the teacher is shown in the top right corner of the report. The left column of the report shows the test date, test level, grade, name of school and name of school district. The gl is the average of three Insight subtest scores: those for Crystallized Knowledge (Gc), Visual Processing (Gv) and Fluid Reasoning (Gf). The gl is a composite of these three tests and is often used as a screener for giftedness.

The sample report shows which students scored in the different Percentile Rank ranges. A student's Percentile Rank is estimated by comparing the student's score to the scores attained by a large sample of students from across Canada who were the same age when they wrote Insight. For example, when a student attains a Percentile Rank of 98, it means that his/ her score is higher than the scores of $98 \%$ of the national norm group.

In the sample report, both Adam Spencer and Bill Stone attained Percentile Ranks somewhere in the range between 16 and 84. This is considered the Average range, as about $68 \%$ of the national student population falls in this range. About $14 \%$ of the student population falls in the Below Average range (Percentile Ranks $2-15$ ) and about $14 \%$ of the student population falls in the Above Average range (Percentile Ranks 85-98).

As a screening instrument, the value of using Insight is in the efficient identification of students in the Lower Extreme (Percentile Rank lower than 2) and in the Upper Extreme (Percentile Rank greater than 98). Students who fall in the Lower and Upper extremes may require further assessment.
